Redwood Empire Endurance Riders invite you to join us at this year's **Cuneo Creek Endurance Ride**. Ride camp and all trails are part of the California Park system in the beautiful Humboldt Redwoods State Park!

Truck & Trailer Restrictions: No combination of truck and trailer over 50' will be allowed. Space is very limited for big rigs. **Measure your rig**, if 51' or longer, please contact the ride manager. There will be a parking docent to help all rigs find their camping location.

Rider Limit: This ride is limited to 90 riders, combined for all distances. Entry requests are filled on first-come, first-served basis. Historically, the ride has filled to its limit, plan accordingly and enter early.

THE TRAIL: Cuneo Creek is a two-day ride. There will be a 50-miler and Limited Distance each day. This is a moderately difficult ride; the trail and weather can be challenging and require good fitness from the equine and rider team. There is varied elevation and technical footing as well as the probability for both heat and humidity. The trails are mostly shaded with plenty of natural water crossings, water troughs and bridges. They are mostly gentle curving single-track trails through old growth redwood, madrone, fir and tan oak forests as well as grasslands. There are access roads and some maintenance dirt roads. Wildlife is abundant; wild turkeys, deer, bears, bees, coyotes and mountain lions.

RIDE CAMP: Located at Humboldt Redwood State Park's Cuneo Creek Horse Camp. The camp has showers, tables, horse corrals (available first-come, first-serve) and pit and flush toilets. Corrals are \$25 per night per horse and payment will be collected at ride camp. Ride Camp opens Friday at noon and closes at noon on Monday. All campsites have been reserved by REER, this includes ALL spaces to the left and right. If you come before Friday, or stay Monday night, you must pay the per night \$35 state park fee, located as you drive into camp.

DIRECTIONS: The camp is approximately 7.3 miles west of Hwy 101 on the road to Honeydew, just north of Weott. Southbound from Eureka, take exit 663 (Rockefeller Forest/Honeydew) at the stop sign turn right on the Mattole Road/Bull Creek Road and proceed west. Northbound from Garberville, take exit 663, left turn at the stop sign and an almost immediate second left turn under the freeway to Mattole Road. Go west through the State Park following Ride Camp signs and ribbons to the Cuneo Creek Horse Camp, just past a small cemetery on the right side of the road. **DRIVE SLOWLY WITH LIGHTS ON & HONK ON BLIND TURNS.** The narrow road is barely two-way weaving through old growth redwoods. Large rigs need to drive very carefully, redwoods win!

Ride Camp Address: Humboldt Redwoods State Park, Cuneo Creek Horse Camp, Mattole Road, Weott, CA 95571.

RIDE RULES: The Cuneo Creek Endurance Ride will comply with all AERC, REER and State Park rules and regulations. All equines must have some type of hoof protection to enter the rides. Dogs are allowed in camp but must be on a 6' leash and comply with all State Park regulations or be subject to ticketing and fines. **PLEASE DO NOT BRING EXTRA VEHICLES OR HORSES.** No smoking in camp or on the trails. Dogs are not allowed on the trail. Manure & hay must be raked and placed in the manure bunkers. There are wheelbarrows to help make your campsite spotless prior to leaving.

Due to limited water service, please DO NOT hose your horse at camp. We encourage you to fill your water tanks before you leave home. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us conserve water use.

Paramount to REER Rides is demonstrating good horsemanship, good sportsmanship and respect for volunteers, other riders, vets and ride management. Our focus is always on family, friends, fun and fairness to the horse.

FOOD: There will be an optional potluck Friday night before the ride meeting. Bring a casserole, salad, dessert plate, or similar addition to share. Included in your entry is a Saturday and/or Sunday night dinner. Extra meals are \$20 each and can be purchased on your entry form or at check-in. All registered volunteers eat for free. We always can use an extra hand so please register at check-in. NOTE - if you ride Sunday only and want to eat Saturday night dinner you will need to purchase the meal for yourself and others in your party.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

FRIDAY Noon registration is open to pick up your rider packet. Will need your vet card and horse to vet in mid-afternoon. Bring your map to the ride meeting and afterwards you can ask questions, and there will also be a volunteer meeting.

SATURDAY MORNING START: 7AM 50 MILERS 8AM LIMITED DISTANCE

SATURDAY NIGHT: A catered dinner will be followed by the awards and review of Sunday's trail. Volunteer and riders bring your dinner ticket/wrist band. If you ride Sunday only you will need to purchase a Saturday dinner if you want to eat with us. Sunday riders only need to bring their horse and vet card Saturday afternoon to vet in. Expect delays and other horses are finishing and receiving their post ride exam.

TWO-DAY RIDERS: Day 1 completion check is also your Day 2 vet in, so bring your Day 2 vet card at your post ride exam.

SUNDAY MORNING START: 7AM 50-MILERS 8AM LIMITED DISTANCE

ENTRY FORM NOTES:

- There are online and paper entries available.
- Juniors ride FREE! Mandatory state drug fee required.
- All riders must show proof of current AERC membership or pay a \$20 non-member fee per day.
- Checks are cashed the week of the ride.
- There is a \$5 discount for REER members.
- REER offers a \$30 Ride Manager discount, one day only but must use a paper entry form.

CANCELLATION / REFUND POLICY:

1. ONLY the rider can cancel an entry. Sponsors can cancel for a Junior rider.
2. REER is not responsible for online system entry processing fees.
3. **Cancellation Refunds:**
 - Full refunds for entries canceled, by written notice to the Ride Manager, at least 7 days prior to the ride (by midnight Friday, Sept. 4th).
 - No full refunds for no shows or within 7 days of the ride.
 - Ride Manager has discretion for late cancellation refund to rider with extenuating /emergency circumstance.
 - For the horse that doesn't pass pre-ride exam, you'll receive a refund less \$35 administrative fee or costs that have been incurred.
 - Current REER members may cancel up to Friday before the ride, with written notice to Ride Manager, and receive a full refund.

CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY:

1. ONLY the rider can cancel an entry. Sponsors can cancel for a Junior Rider.

2. REER is NOT responsible for online system processing fees.

3. Cancellation Refunds:

- When a rider gives written notice to the Ride Manager at least one week (7 days) prior to the ride (by midnight Friday, July 31st) a full refund will be offered.
- REER does not provide a refund for no-shows.
- Ride Manager has the discretion for late cancellation refund for a rider who has an extenuating/emergency circumstance.
- For the horse that doesn't pass the pre-ride vet exam, you'll receive a refund, less \$35 administrative fee or costs incurred.
- Refunds are issued when and how it is convenient for the Ride Manager.
- Current REER members may cancel up to Friday before the ride (with written notice to RM) and receive a full refund.

REER & AERC RIDER RELEASE of LIABILITY:

I wish to participate in the Redwood Ride, which is sponsored by the Redwood Empire Endurance Riders (REER). Furthermore, I do hereby acknowledge that said release extends to any accidents, damages, or claims arising out of my entry caused by my own act or by the acts of anyone or any animal under my supervision.
